Mildmay is working to ease the burden on NHS hospitals during the COVID-19 pandemic

Pivotal changes are taking place at Mildmay as we work with NHS England, the Minister for Health, Healthy London Partnership and our partner NHS Hospitals to expand our services to address the most pressing needs of vulnerable people.

Over the past year the charity has had a vital role in London's response to the COVID-19 pandemic, caring for people with HIV, as well as providing new services for homeless step-down patients and those recovering from COVID-19, and we have demonstrated that we can operate under the most challenging conditions.

It is not yet certain that Mildmay can continue to provide HIV care in addition to step-down hospital care for the homeless, but this is our hope. Our partner charities involved in both HIV and homeless work across the capital, the UK and beyond strongly support us in the negotiations with our health commissioners.

We hope and pray that we will succeed and that this will be the bedrock of Mildmay's work in the future in the United Kingdom, the Lord being our helper.
